The iShares Carbon Efficient Index Brasil Index Fund seeks to obtain returns on investments that correspond, in general, to the performance, before fees and expenses, of the Carbon Efficient Index. The Carbon Efficient Index-ICO2 is a market index that measures the return on an investment in a theoretical portfolio calculated by B3 and by BNDDES comprised of stocks of companies participating in the IBrX-50 that agreed to participate in this initiative, adopting transparent practices in respect to their emissions of greenhouse gases (GHGs). Such stocks are weighted in the Index portfolio based on the GHG emissions efficiency levels of the companies as well as on the free float (total shares outstanding) of each company.

GLOSSARY

Beta is a measure of the tendency of securities to move with the market as a whole. A beta of 1 indicates that the security's price will move with the market. A beta less than 1 indicates the security tends to be less volatile than the market, while a beta greater than 1 indicates the security is more volatile than the market.

The price to earnings ratio (P/E) is a fundamental measure used to determine if an investment is valued appropriately. Each holding's P/E is the latest closing price divided by the latest fiscal year's earnings per share. Negative P/E ratios are excluded from this calculation. For hedged funds, the underlying fund's value is shown.

The price to book (P/B) value ratio is a fundamental measure used to determine if an investment is valued appropriately. The book value of a company is a measure of how much a company's assets are worth assuming the company's debts are paid off. Each holding's P/B is the latest closing price divided by the latest fiscal year's book value per share. Negative book values are excluded from this calculation. For hedged funds, the underlying fund's value is shown.
