Management Discussion of Fund Performance

BlackRock Asset Management Canada Limited ("BlackRock Canada") is pleased to provide you with the Management Report of Fund Performance ("MRFP") for the iShares S&P 500 3% Capped Index ETF (the "Fund") for the year ended December 31, 2025. You and your financial advisor can use this information along with the annual and interim financial statements of the Fund to assess the Fund's performance and how your investment in the Fund aligns with your overall financial plan.

The Fund is an exchange-traded fund which trades on the Toronto Stock Exchange (the "Exchange"). Investors typically buy and sell units of the Fund through a brokerage account. The Fund's Exchange ticker symbol is XUSC for the Canadian dollar denominated units ("CAD Units") and XUSC.U for the U.S. dollar denominated units ("USD Units").

References to "net assets" or "net assets per unit" in this MRFP are references to net assets attributable to holders of redeemable units determined in accordance with the International Financial Reporting Standards, as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ("IFRS Accounting Standards") as presented in the Fund's financial statements. All references to "net asset value" or "net asset value per unit" in this MRFP are references to net asset value determined in accordance with National Instrument 81-106 – *Investment Fund Continuous Disclosure* which is used for all purposes except for the financial statements, including for Fund pricing purposes in connection with subscriptions, exchanges and redemptions.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The investment objective of the Fund is to provide long-term capital growth by replicating, to the extent possible, the performance of the S&P 500 3% Capped Index (the "Index"), net of expenses. Under normal market conditions, the Fund will primarily invest in U.S. equity securities and/or securities of one or more exchange-traded funds managed by BlackRock Canada or an affiliate. The Index is a float adjusted market capitalization-weighted index of equity securities of the 500 largest U.S. public issuers. The weight of each constituent issuer is capped at 3%. The Index will proportionally redistribute all excess weight to all uncapped companies. The weight of a constituent issuer may exceed these limits due to changes in security prices from time to time.

The Fund uses an indexing strategy to achieve its investment objective. Under this strategy, the Fund seeks to replicate the performance of the Index, net of expenses, by employing, directly or indirectly through investment in one or more exchange-traded funds managed by BlackRock Canada or an affiliate and/or through the use of derivatives, a replicating strategy or sampling strategy. A replicating strategy is an investment strategy intended to replicate the performance of the Index by investing, directly or indirectly, primarily in a portfolio of index securities in substantially the same proportions as they are represented in the Index. A sampling strategy is an investment strategy intended to replicate the performance of the Index by investing, directly or indirectly, primarily in a representative portfolio of securities that has an aggregate investment profile similar to the Index. The securities selected are expected to have, in the aggregate, investment characteristics, fundamental characteristics and liquidity measures similar to those of the Index, as more fully described in the Fund's prospectus.

The Fund's current principal investment strategy is to employ a replicating strategy.

Risk

The risks of investing in the Fund are described in the prospectus. There have been no changes to the Fund over the financial period that materially affected the risk level of the Fund.

Results of Operations

The Fund's net asset value increased from \$84.3 million at December 31, 2024 to \$256.4 million at December 31, 2025. This change in net asset value represents an increase of \$156.7 million due to net subscriptions to the Fund and an increase of \$15.4 million due to investment operations less distributions paid.

For the year ended December 31, 2025, the Fund's CAD Units returned 11.29% versus the Index which returned 11.19%. The main reasons for the difference in performance of 0.10% between the Fund's CAD Units and the Index were management fees (-0.12%) and other miscellaneous factors (0.22%).

For the year ended December 31, 2025, the Fund's USD Units returned 16.77% versus the Index which returned 16.66%. The main reasons for the difference in performance of 0.11% between the Fund's USD Units and the Index were management fees (-0.12%) and other miscellaneous factors (+0.23%).

The Fund has a distribution policy that requires it to distribute sufficient net income and net realized capital gains so that it will not be liable to pay income tax under Part I of the *Income Tax Act* (Canada). Amounts included in the calculation of net income and net realized capital gains of the Fund for a taxation year, that must be distributed in accordance with the distribution policy, sometimes include amounts that have not actually been received by the Fund.

The Fund may borrow cash in accordance with the restrictions in National Instrument 81-102 – *Investment Funds*, and, in accordance with the terms of exemptive relief, as a temporary measure to fund the portion of any distributions payable to unitholders that represents amounts that have not yet been received by the Fund. Pursuant to such relief, the borrowing may not be for a period longer than 45 days, and the Fund is limited to borrowing up to the amount of the distribution that is payable to, but has not yet been received, by the Fund and, in any event, not more than 5% of the net assets of the Fund. For the year ended December 31, 2025, the Fund did not borrow any cash.

Recent Developments

Independent Review Committee ("IRC") Appointments & Resignations

Effective June 1, 2025, Cathy Welling replaced Geoffrey Creighton as the Chair of the IRC.

Effective November 30, 2025, Geoffrey Creighton ceased to be a member of the IRC.

Effective December 1, 2025, Peter von Schilling and Jane Waechter were appointed as members of the IRC.

Related Party Transactions

Trustee, Manager and Portfolio Advisor

BlackRock Canada, an indirect, wholly-owned subsidiary of BlackRock, Inc. ("BlackRock"), is the trustee, manager, and portfolio advisor of the Fund and is responsible for the day-to-day administration of the Fund. The Fund pays annual management fees to BlackRock Canada as consideration for its services. In addition, BlackRock Canada and/or an affiliate, as applicable, acts as trustee or manager of any iShares ETF in which the Fund invests.

The Fund is permitted to purchase, sell and hold securities of certain issuers that are directly or indirectly related to BlackRock Canada (currently including, but not limited to, BlackRock). With respect to investment in related issuers, BlackRock Canada has relied on the approval that it has received from the IRC. The approval requires BlackRock Canada to comply with its current policy and procedures regarding investments in related issuers and to report periodically to the IRC.

The Fund may execute inter-fund trades. Inter-fund trading is the buying and selling of portfolio securities between funds for which BlackRock Canada serves as trustee and manager and managed accounts to which BlackRock Canada serves as manager. With respect to inter-fund trades, BlackRock Canada has relied on the approval that it has received from the IRC. The approval requires BlackRock Canada to comply with its current policy and procedures regarding inter-fund trading and to report periodically to the IRC.

BlackRock Canada has agreed to be responsible for the fees and expenses of the Fund except the annual management fees, any fees and expenses related to the operation of the IRC under National Instrument 81-107 - *Independent Review Committee for Investment Funds*, brokerage expenses and commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, income tax, harmonized sales tax ("HST"), and withholding and other taxes. The Fund is also responsible for other fees and expenses in accordance with the terms of its trust document, such as extraordinary expenses or expenses incurred in connection with the recovery of amounts due to the Fund, as applicable.

Securities Lending Agents

The Fund has engaged BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A. ("BTC") and BlackRock Advisors (UK) Limited ("BRAL"), affiliates of BlackRock Canada, as securities lending agents. To mitigate risks from securities lending, the Fund benefits from a borrower default indemnity provided by BlackRock, an affiliate of BlackRock Canada. BlackRock's indemnity allows for full replacement of securities lent in the event that the borrower defaults on its obligation to return the loaned securities and collateral received is insufficient to reconstitute the portfolio of loaned securities. BTC and/or BRAL bear all operational costs directly related to securities lending as well as the cost of borrower default indemnification. For the year ended December 31, 2025, the Fund earned \$3,247 from counterparties in securities lending income. BTC and BRAL are entitled to receive a portion of the total securities lending income earned from counterparties for their role as lending agents.

BlackRock Canada relies on a positive recommendation and standing instruction that it has received from the IRC with respect to the securities lending activities of the Fund, including the appointment of and payment to its affiliates as securities lending agents. The standing instruction requires BlackRock Canada to comply with its current policy and procedures regarding securities lending and to report periodically to the IRC.

Sub-Advisor

BlackRock Canada has appointed its affiliate, BTC, as the sub-advisor of the Fund. As compensation for its services as sub-advisor, BlackRock Canada pays BTC a portion of the management fees paid by the Fund to BlackRock Canada.

Management Fees

The management fees are calculated based on 0.12% per annum of the average daily net asset value of the Fund. The fees are accrued daily and are generally paid monthly, but in any case not less than quarterly. For the year ended December 31, 2025, the Fund accrued \$240,558 (excluding GST and HST in the amount of \$23,833) in management fees. These management fees were received by BlackRock Canada for managing the portfolio, maintaining portfolio systems used to manage the Fund, maintaining the www.blackrock.com/ca website, and providing all other services including marketing and promotion.

The total annual fees were received by BlackRock Canada and/or its affiliate, as applicable, for managing the Fund's portfolio and the portfolio of any iShares ETF in which the Fund invests, maintaining portfolio systems used to manage the Fund and any iShares ETF, maintaining the www.blackrock.com/ca website, and providing all other services including marketing and promotion.

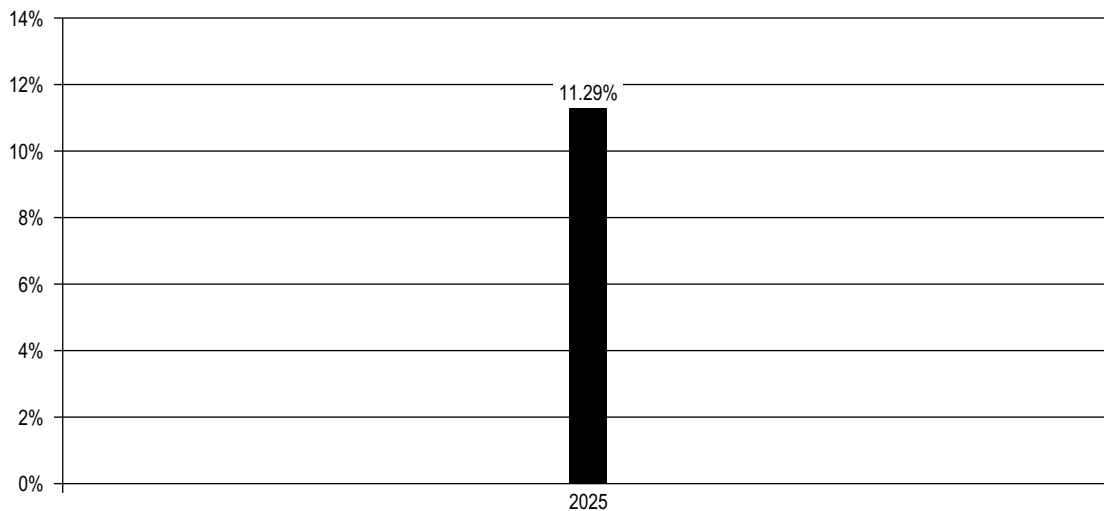
Past Performance

CAD Units commencement: July 09, 2024

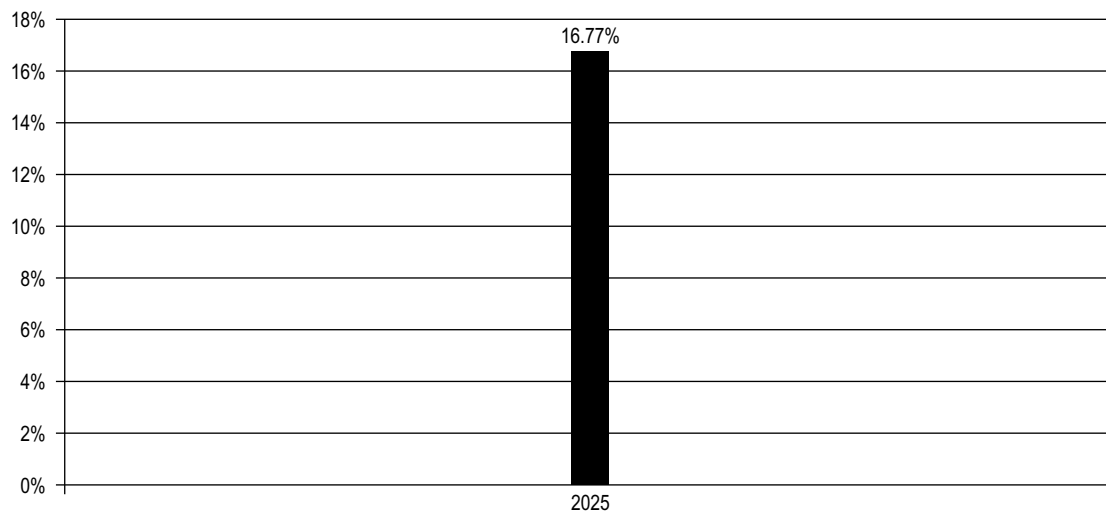
