This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

## Product

**iShares Developed World Screened Index Fund (IE)** (the "Fund"), **Flexible Accumulation Accu EUR** (the "Unit Class"), ISIN: **IE000NWZMWU9**, is authorised in Ireland and manufactured by BlackRock Asset Management Ireland Limited (the "Manager") which is part of the BlackRock, Inc group.

The Manager is authorised in Ireland and regulated by the Central Bank of Ireland (the "CBI") and the CBI is responsible for supervising the Manager in relation to this Key Information Document.

## What is this product?

**Type:** The Fund is a sub-fund of BlackRock Index Selection Fund, an umbrella unit trust, authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland as a Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities ("UCITS").

**Term:** The Fund does not have a fixed term of existence or maturity period but in certain circumstances, as described in the Fund prospectus, the Fund may be unilaterally terminated following written notice to unitholders subject to compliance with the Fund prospectus and applicable regulation.

## Objectives

- The Fund aims to achieve a return on your investment, through a combination of capital growth and income on the Fund's assets, which reflects the return of the developed world equity markets excluding companies that are involved in or generate a majority of their revenue and income from activities that may have a detrimental impact from the environmental, social and governance (ESG) perspective
- The Fund is passively managed and aims to invest in equity securities (e.g. shares) that, so far as possible and practicable, make up the MSCI World Screened Index (the "Index").
- The Fund's investments will, at the time of purchase, comply with the ESG requirements of the Index. The Fund may hold securities which do not comply with the ESG requirements of the Index until such time as the relevant securities cease to form part of the Index and it is possible and practicable (in the investment manager's view) to liquidate the position.
- The Index measures the performance of a sub-set of equity securities within the MSCI World Index (the Parent Index) which excludes issuers from the Parent Index based on the index provider's ESG exclusionary criteria. For further details please refer to the prospectus. The remaining securities are then weighted by their free-float adjusted market capitalisation. Free float adjusted means that only shares readily available in the market rather than all of a company's issued shares are used in calculating the Index. Free float-adjusted market capitalisation is the share price of a company multiplied by the number of shares readily available in the market. The Index also excludes issuers which are identified by the index provider as being involved in controversies that have a negative ESG impact based on an MSCI ESG controversy score set by the index provider.
- The Parent Index measures the performance of large and mid-capitalisation shares across developed countries which comply with the index provider's size, liquidity and free-float criteria.
- The Fund adopts a binding and significant ESG integration approach to sustainable investing i.e. the Fund will integrate ESG information into investment processes to achieve a weighted average environmental rating of the Fund at least 20% better as compared to the Parent Index.
- The Fund may also engage in short-term secured lending of its investments to certain eligible third parties. This is used as a means of generating additional income and to off-set the costs of the Fund.
- The price of equity securities fluctuates daily and may be influenced by factors affecting the performance of the individual companies issuing the equities, as well as by daily stock market movements, and broader economic and political developments which in turn may affect the value of your investment.
- The return on your investment in the Fund is directly related to the value of the underlying assets of the Fund, less costs (see "What are the costs?" below).
- The relationship between the return on your investment, how it is impacted and the period for which you hold your investment is considered below (see "How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?").
- The depositary of the Fund is J.P. Morgan SE – Dublin Branch.

- Your units will be accumulating units (i.e. dividend income will be included in their value).
- The Fund's base currency is US Dollar. Units for this class are bought and sold in Euro. The performance of your units may be affected by this currency difference.
- Your units will be hedged with the aim of reducing the effect of exchange rate fluctuations between the denominated currency of the units and the Fund's underlying portfolio currencies or the Fund's base currency. FDIs, including FX forward contracts, will be used for currency hedging purposes. The hedging strategy may not completely eliminate currency risk and, therefore, may affect the performance of your units. Please see the prospectus for further details.
- You can buy and sell your units daily. The minimum initial investment for this unit class is €1,000,000.

**Intended retail investor:** The Fund is intended for retail investors with the ability to bear losses up to the amount invested in the Fund (see "How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?").

**Insurance benefits:** The Fund does not offer any insurance benefits.

### What happens if BlackRock Asset Management Ireland Limited is unable to pay out?

The assets of the Fund are held in safekeeping by its depositary, J.P. Morgan SE – Dublin Branch (the "Depositary"). In the event of the insolvency of the Manager, the Fund's assets in the safekeeping of the Depositary will not be affected. However, in the event of the Depositary's insolvency, or someone acting on its behalf, the Fund may suffer a financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to a certain extent by the fact the Depositary is required by law and regulation to segregate its own assets from the assets of the Fund. The Depositary will also be liable to the Fund and the investors for any loss arising from, among other things, its negligence, fraud or intentional failure properly to fulfil its obligations (subject to certain limitations). As a shareholder of the Fund you would not be able to make a claim to the UK Financial Services Compensation Scheme or any other scheme about the Fund in the event that the Fund is unable to pay out.

## What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

**Costs over time:** The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does.
