

Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

Product

BlackRock Multi Asset Conservative Selection Fund (the "Fund"), **Class A Accu EUR** (the "Unit Class"), ISIN: **IE00BFMM8X74**, is authorised in Ireland and manufactured by BlackRock Asset Management Ireland Limited (the "Manager") which is part of the BlackRock, Inc group.

The Manager is authorised in Ireland and regulated by the Central Bank of Ireland (the "CBI") and the CBI is responsible for supervising the Manager in relation to this Key Information Document.

What is this product?

Type: The Fund is a sub-fund of BlackRock UCITS Funds, an umbrella unit trust, authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland as a Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities ("UCITS").

Term: The Fund does not have a fixed term of existence or maturity period but in certain circumstances, as described in the Fund prospectus, the Fund may be unilaterally terminated following written notice to unitholders subject to compliance with the Fund prospectus and applicable regulation.

Objectives

- The Fund seeks to maximize the return on your investment through a combination of capital growth and income on the Fund's assets over the long term commensurate with a conservative level of risk.
- The Fund has a flexible approach to asset allocation and will seek to diversify its exposure across a variety of asset classes globally. The Fund will seek to achieve its investment objective by investing between 40% and 90% of its assets in other funds including exchange traded funds (ETFs), to gain exposure to fixed income (FI) securities (e.g. bonds), between 10% and 50% of its assets in other funds, including ETFs, to gain exposure to equity securities (e.g. shares), and up to 30% in other funds, including ETFs, which seek to diversify their exposure across a variety of asset classes, including equity, FI, money market instruments (MMIs) (e.g. debt instruments with short-term maturities), deposits, cash and financial derivative instruments (FDIs) (i.e. investments the prices of which are based on one or more underlying assets).
- Generally, the Fund will seek to be positioned such that the Fund's risk as measured by annualised volatility over a rolling 5 year period falls within the range of 4%-8%, however, the Fund's risk profile may fall outside the stated range from time to time. Volatility is the measure of fluctuations of the returns of a given investment. Generally, the higher the volatility, the riskier the investment.
- For the purpose of managing currency exposure, the Investment Manager (IM) may use investment techniques (which may include the use of FDIs) to protect the value of the Fund, in whole or part, from changes in currency exchange rates against the base currency of the Fund. FDIs are investments the prices of which are based on one or more underlying assets.
- The Fund is actively managed. The IM has discretion to select the Fund's investments. The Fund is also designed to provide investors with achievement of the investment objective by typically taking a moderate level of absolute risk in order to seek a commensurate return in excess of applicable management fees over the long term (i.e. 5 years or more).
- The price of underlying funds changes regularly depending on the performance of the assets held by the underlying funds which in turn may affect the value of your investment.
- The Fund invests in fixed income securities, equity securities and collective investment schemes and so the value of your investment may be affected by the factors which impact the value of those asset classes.
- The return on your investment in the Fund is directly related to the value of the underlying assets of the Fund, less costs (see "What are the costs?" below).
- The relationship between the return on your investment, how it is impacted and the period for which you hold your investment is considered below (see "How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?").
- The depositary of the Fund is J.P. Morgan SE – Dublin Branch.

- Your units will be accumulating units (i.e. dividend income will be included in their value).
- Your units will be denominated in Euro, the Fund's base currency.
- You can buy and sell your units daily. The minimum initial investment for this unit class is €5,000,000.

Intended retail investor: The Fund is intended for retail investors with the ability to bear losses up to the amount invested in the Fund (see "How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?").

Insurance benefits: The Fund does not offer any insurance benefits.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk Indicator



- The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.
- We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium low risk class. What happens if BlackRock Asset Management Ireland Limited is unable to pay out?

The assets of the Fund are held in safekeeping by its depositary, J.P. Morgan SE – Dublin Branch (the "Depositary"). In the event of the insolvency of the Manager, the Fund's assets in the safekeeping of the Depositary will not be affected. However, in the event of the Depositary's insolvency, or someone acting on its behalf, the Fund may suffer a financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to a certain extent by the fact the Depositary is required by law and regulation to segregate its own assets from the assets of the Fund. The Depositary will also be liable to the Fund and the investors for any loss arising from, among other things, its negligence, fraud or intentional failure properly to fulfil its obligations (subject to certain limitations). As a shareholder of the Fund you would not be able to make a claim to the UK Financial Services Compensation Scheme or any other scheme about the Fund in the event that the Fund is unable to pay out.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time: The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0 % annual return).
- For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
