

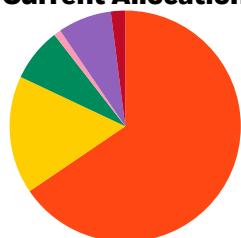
## BlackRock Target Allocation Multi-Manager with Alts 80/20 Model

### Investment Strategy

This investment strategy seeks total return through exposure to a diversified portfolio of equity, fixed income and liquid alternative asset classes with a target risk similar to a benchmark composed of 80% equities and 20% fixed income assets. It invests in both BlackRock (which may pay fees and expenses to BlackRock that are in addition to the fees payable to BlackRock for managing the account) and Third-Party Exchange Traded Funds and Mutual Funds. Selection of this strategy indicates a willingness to assume some risk of principal loss. The principal risks of the strategy are equity risk, fixed income risk, foreign/international market risk and derivative risk general. Prior to December 2020 this composite was known as BlackRock 80/20 Target Allocation. More detailed information on this strategy is available upon request.

The Benchmark is currently composed of: 56% MSCI ACWI Index, 24% MSCI USA Index, 18% Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Universal Index, 2% ICE BofAML US T-Bill 0-3 Month. Prior to 06/30/2021 the benchmark was 56% MSCI ACWI Index and 24% MSCI U.S. Index for the Equity Sleeve (80%) and Barclays U.S. Universal Bond Index for the Fixed Income Sleeve (20%) and is rebalanced quarterly.
